I am pleased to write in support of Daniel Elles. I met Daniel in the fall of 2023 as a student in my LEX 5000 Law in Social Context class at Wayne State University. This was a three-credit synchronous online class that met each Thursday evening via Zoom for 2.5 hours.

He elevated his partner's work product through his discipline and attention to detail during their collaboration. During the class presentations, he was attentive and supportive of his classmates.
